Also, reminders to not touch face, mouth, nose or eyes. Ensure that there is a constant supply of handwashing facilities at every sink on site (toilet block, office, crew quarters and Hornbeam Lodge). Checked daily.

Danemead does not offer any activity equipment for hire so this is not a concern.

Where it is not possible to maintain a minimum of 1m then both persons should wear face masks and any work activity should be kept to the minimum time possible. Staff and volunteers to be reminded of the requirement to adhere to government social distancing guidelines Staggered arrival and departure times when more than one Group attending site and individual Groups encouraged to stagger drop-off and pick-up times.

<p>Spread of Coronavirus (Covid-19) from person to person through respiration or contact with contaminated surfaces.</p>	<p>Staff and volunteers, contractors, Young people and leaders, ad-hoc site visitors</p>	<p>Preventing the virus from entering the site</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signage at entrance to site and on all buildings requesting that any person displaying symptoms of Covid-19 return home and follow current Government and NHS guidelines. • Any person who has been in contact with anybody subsequently confirmed as having the virus or who has been in close proximity to somebody who has been required to self-isolate should follow current Government and NHS guidelines. In addition they should not enter the site until they have a negative PCR test result. • Any person who is suspected, or shows symptoms, of having the virus must leave the site immediately and follow current government and NHS guidelines. • Any person who subsequently feels the need to self-isolate within fourteen days of attending site must notify the site manager electronically who will then follow the guidelines given to them by Public Health England.

The crew accommodation should be adequately ventilated during use and regular disinfection of surfaces and door handles is routinely carried out throughout the period of their visit. • Users of Hornbeam Lodge should ensure that it is adequately ventilated during occupation and that regular disinfection of surfaces and door handles is routinely carried out throughout the period of their visit. • The nursery school in Hornbeam Lodge operates Monday – Friday. They are responsible for adhering to their own risk assessment in line with the guidance produced by Public Health England. • The nursery school in Hornbeam Lodge is responsible for ensuring that all areas used during the week are thoroughly disinfected prior to handing the building back to the campsite on Friday afternoon. • The nursery school in Hornbeam Lodge is responsible for ensuring that the building is adequately ventilated during use.
